SUB: 6-day ROT programme in Materia Medica

After the successful completion of Modules I and II, I am pleased to inform you that through Department of AYUSH, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India has we would proceed with the revised Reorientation training program for Teachers of Homoeopathic Colleges in the subject of *Materia Medica*, Module III. This is designed as a module-based programme which will cover the teaching of the entire subject. The following is a gist of the entire programme for the post graduate teachers.

Modules:

1. Different types of materia medica, their importance and methods of teaching.
2. Study of therapeutics and demonstrate its application through the clinical cases and a comparative study of materia medica.
3. How to build the evolutionary drug pictures through the study of the human being in different dimensions.
4. Therapeutic application of drugs in the form Mother Tinctures, Bio-chemic, Nosodes, and rare drugs in practice and recent advances.

We would take up the Module 3 for this ROT, the detailed topics are mentioned below:

Module 3

How to build the images through the study of the human being as a whole in its evolution. This module will highlight the process of building living images of the remedy. The process will require an insight in to aphorism six and the understanding about the demand of aphorism 3, 4, and 5. Exploring the Hahnemannian concept of Man, applying it in the current socio-cultural, political and economical situation to fine tune and modify the Materia medica pictures. Integrating the different knowledges to built the living images of the Materia medica. Using the advances made in the field of psychology to derive the finer picture of remedy at level of mind using the psychodynamic and psychosomatic study.

Fundamental Principles

Our Institute has had interesting experiences in the integrated practice and teaching of Homoeopathic subjects of Organon and Homoeopathic Philosophy, Materia Medica and Repertory. Our founder, the late Dr. M. L. Dhawale, fervently believed in this integrated approach and considered a balanced understanding of all the three as essential to the correct appreciation of the Totality. This approach will form the core of the training programme. We have focussed on case based study of materia medica which

will help in understanding this most volatile subject and also help to integrate Materia Medica with Organon and Homoeopathic Philosophy, Repertory and clinical subjects like medicine, paediatrics and psychiatry.

Methodology

The exposure will comprise of practical clinical sessions and presentations. The participants would derive benefit from the rich clinical material from different Clinical centres of the Institute and from a variety of approaches presented by able teachers of the subject from all over the country. A variety of techniques would be utilized e.g. clinical work, case analysis, case processing, and references to various source books. This module will focus on the Hahnemannian concept of man and its application in the current scenario and through it building up of living materia medica images. Our methodology has always been case based and this methodology is more so required in this module. This would help us to understand the different drugs of materia medica as live images with special emphasis on the current socio-cultural and political scenario.

Two topics remaining from the last module due to unavoidable circumstances will also be completed in this module.
