**Subject: 6-days ROT programme in Repertory and Case Taking from 30th
March – 4th April 09 at Mumbai centre in Dahisar (East)**

Respected Sir/Madam,

The Department of AYUSH, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, has sanctioned us a Reorientation training programme for the teachers of Homoeopathic colleges in the subject of Repertory.

We are happy to inform you that MLDMHI has so far successfully conducted 9 ROTPs in various subjects. They have received excellent feedbacks from the participants for the extent and depth of the topics. The presentations were noteworthy for the rich case material circulated in advance and the interactive style of presentations. Now the Dept. of AYUSH has asked us to conduct a second round of ROTPs in all those subjects. Accordingly, we are arranging a Reorientation training program for Postgraduate Teachers of Homoeopathic Colleges in the subject of Repertory and Case Taking according to the modules prepared by the Department of AYUSH. The objectives of the program are as follows:

Objectives:

- (i) To structure the teaching of the subject on the basic disciplines of Logic and Homoeopathic Philosophy and the relevant portions of Psychology, Sociology and Communication skills
- (ii) To demonstrate the foundation of the subject in a deeper study of the 'Organon of Medicine' and the conceptual framework of Homoeopathic philosophy.
- (iii) To teach the different methods of communicating case taking principles, methods and techniques.
- (iv) To demonstrate the importance of self evaluation in mastering skills of case taking.
- (v) To demonstrate the role of documentation and recording symptoms in accord with the philosophical principle of classification and evaluation.
- (vi) To demonstrate the case-based approach in imparting the principles of Repertorization.
- (vii) To evolve the mechanisms by which common clinical rubrics are distinguished from peculiar, individualistic rubrics on the merits of the case.
- (viii) To explore the philosophical bases of the different software programs in existence and to work out the methods of exploiting these to the full.
- (ix) To acquire familiarity with the lesser known works of the masters of the subject.
- (x) To explore different ways and means of guiding a student to explore the subject deeply through the dissertation.

- (xi) To acquire familiarity with the basic statistical concepts and techniques which are of use to the learner in his /her dissertation work.

We would take up the Module 4 for this ROT, the detailed topics of which are mentioned below:

Module 4

Recent advances in the literature of Repertory. Demonstrations of different softwares on different repertory and their use in the selection of medicines. Comparative study of Homoeopathic software programs: Homopath, RADAR, CARA/ISIS etc.

Participants and faculties:

There are limited seats in the programme. You are requested to sponsor teacher/s from your institution. As per the rules, they will be eligible for reimbursement of the actual fare of AC 2 tier class. They would be paid Rs. 1000/- per day to cover their lodging and boarding expenses. No other expenses are payable. Accommodation is expensive in Mumbai but we have made economic and suitable arrangements in a hotel near the venue. Kindly contact me if you need any help on this.
